Proposed 3G Football Pitches, New Changing & Community Facilities

Land to the west of Thorpe Park, Leeds

Leeds City Council and the Football Foundation are pleased to present proposals for a new community sports hub at Green Park (land to the west of Thorpe Park, Leeds).

This leaflet includes information about the scheme and invites you to provide your feedback directly to us.

Green Park

Green Park is part of a wider approved masterplan which includes the adjacent Thorpe Park development. Our planning application is to amend part of the existing Green Park approval from four grass pitches and a pavilion building to now contain artificial grass pitches and enhanced community facilities, such as walking and cycling routes developed to link into the wider masterplan.

Community Sports Hub

Our proposals form part of an aspiration to improve facilities in grassroots football across the City through investment in pitches, facilities and participation programmes; therefore creating benefits in terms of sports participation, community activity and health & well-being.



Our proposed site plan for the community sports hub




Diagram showing proposed wider masterplan for Green Park

What will our scheme bring to the area?

Our scheme will include four floodlit 3G artificial grass football pitches that will be available for public use including by local football clubs. A supporting pavilion building is also proposed containing changing facilities, a community café and meeting rooms. This development can provide a host of benefits to the local community, such as:

- A variety of formal and informal landscaping as part of the proposed wider parkland setting
- Much needed sports facilities and open space for the locality
- Pedestrian and cycling routes designed to connect the scheme with Green Park, Thorpe Park and the local area
- The scheme will encourage community engagement and inclusion as well as improved health & well-being for user's of the facility
- On-site parking (accessed from Thorpe Park) will be available for users of the sports hub and Green Park
- The proposed layout of the 3G pitches has been carefully considered to minimise impact on existing trees and surrounding properties.
